

## <u>LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR, REVD DR STEVE STEWART</u> <u>The Original Atheists!</u>

I love atheists. I have found conversations with atheists to be some of the most rewarding of all. They make me think carefully about what I believe and why. For example, as a believer in Jesus Christ I hold Jesus' resurrection from the dead to be not **s**imply a "nice thing to believe" but a fact of history! This and much else that Christians believe is, at face value, ridiculous.

The claims of Christianity would be, without supporting evidence, absurd: God created the universe?; God came to earth as a man?; The Bible is the inspired word of God?; Jesus Christ gave sight to the blind?; Jesus rose from the dead? The list goes on and on. Atheists have every right to question these things, and nothing helps my faith more than that they do so! I have a responsibility both as a Christian and as the Rector of the parishes of Hanborough and Freeland to provide coherent evidence-based answers to these issues.

Let us remember that Christianity is an ancient faith. In the ancient world there were two types of beliefs at work: Judaism and paganism. Judaism believed in one God and ancient pagans (Gentiles) believed in many gods. Then Christianity with its one Jewish God came along, with many pagans becoming Christians. If you converted from paganism to Christianity, you went from believing in many gods to just one God. And what insult would your community level at you? That you were an "atheist" – you'd stopped believing in the many gods. Yes, Christians were the original atheists! There are thousands of gods which you and I alike do not believe in! And so I remind myself that when I am speaking as a believer in Jesus Christ with an atheist, we have more in common than might at first be thought. At some level, I see something of a kindred spirit!

Occasionally, I have conversations with atheists where I want to establish that both of us believe things which are, in philosophical and forensic terms, equally ludicrous: the atheist might assert that the universe came from nothing or that the Bible is a hoax. For my part, I want to assert the claim that Jesus Christ rose from the dead. Both of us need to provide evidence to support our "ridiculous" claims.

We hope sometime next year to even offer a forum where these things can be discussed thoughtfully and intelligently; where atheists are welcome to come and quiz me and others on these types of question, so that together we might seek and find truth. Just for me to get a feel for this sort of thing, drop me a line if you think that's something you might find interesting (it will commit you to nothing!)



#### **October News - Trees**

Seasonal Spotlight – Autumn

It's that time of year when the trees will be changing colour, the air is getting colder and fresher, and we can't help thinking of warm drinks, cosy clothes and playing in the crunchy leaves.

As we enter Autumn, it can be tempting to cut back all the dead and dying vegetation in our gardens and green spaces. It's worth considering that many of these woody stems will become perfect winter homes for insects as they enter hibernation and can create areas of architectural beauty in our homes and communities.

In Oxfordshire, the hedgerow species we generally recommend planting (for their capacity to provide for both people and wildlife year-round) and you're most likely to see in your local area, include Blackthorn, Spindle, Common Buckthorn, Guelder Rose, Wild Privet, Cherry Plum, Dog Rose and Hazel. Fruiting season for many of these species starts from late summer to early autumn. As such, by this time of year, most of the species listed above will be fruiting. Hawthorn berries have traditional use in heart-strengthening natural medicines but also act as a vital source of food for caterpillars, moths, and migratory birds. Keep your eyes peeled for spindle, which has vibrant autumnal colours with vibrant pinks, and the leaves turning from a deep green to a beautiful red.

#### **OXRAIL2040 PLAN**

Oxfordshire County Council has released its public consultation on the OxRail2040 Plan for Rail, setting out proposals to transform the county's rail network and deliver better connections for local communities.

At the heart of the plan are long-awaited improvements to the Cotswold Line, including a commitment to deliver two trains per hour serving Hanborough station. This would significantly enhance Hanborough's role as a key transport hub for West Oxfordshire, petter linking the district with Oxford, London, and the wider region.

Cllr Liam Walker, County Councillor for Hanborough and Hailey, has welcomed the launch of the consultation: "This has been a long campaign to secure the much-needed mprovements to the Cotswold Line, and I am delighted to see this ambitious plan being put forward. Hanborough station is already one of the fastest-growing stations in the county, and the commitment to deliver two trains per hour will make a huge difference for local residents, businesses, and visitors. It is vital that West Oxfordshire has a reliable and sustainable transport hub, and I fully support the need to push for further improvements to Hanborough station."

Alongside the Cotswold Line proposals, the OxRail2040 Plan for Rail includes a series of other major projects designed to improve connectivity across Oxfordshire.

These include:

Reopening the Cowley Branch Line for passenger services, linking key employment sites and thousands of homes in South Oxford to the main rail network.

Upgrading Oxford Station to improve capacity, accessibility, and passenger experience. Electrification and capacity enhancements to reduce journey times and make the rail network more sustainable.

New stations and better interchange facilities to connect growing communities with jobs and services.

Residents, businesses, and community groups are encouraged to share their views on the plan during the consultation period. Feedback will help shape the final strategy and ensure it reflects the needs of Oxfordshire's growing population.

# WEST OXFORDSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL BACKS A NEW AMBITIOUS NATURE RECOVERY STRATEGY

WODC Executive endorsed a new countywide strategy aimed at protecting and enhancing the natural environment across the county.

The Local Nature Recovery Strategy (LNRS) is a collaborative initiative led by Oxfordshire CC, which involves the assessment of a priority network of existing habitats and identified opportunities for future habitat enhancements. The strategy provides a clear and evidence-based framework to deliver **more**, **bigger and more connected habitats** and offers multiple benefits for communities, including natural flood management and water quality regulation, as well as wider opportunities to enjoy nature-rich green spaces.

The LNRS has been shaped through extensive collaboration between the local authorities and expert organisations and individuals. WODC played a key role as the supporting authority. The draft of the strategy was subject to public consultation in 2024, which generated over two thousand responses.

The LNRS will play a key role in delivering Biodiversity Net Gain in the district. It will also have a central role in developing West Oxfordshire's new Local Plan 2041, informing decisions on where development should happen and which areas need protection and enhancements.

Low Carbon Hub, with communities in and around Eynsham, have developed the UK's first Community Action Plan for Zero-Carbon Energy (CAPZero) and are now entering Year 2 of its implementation.

The project aims to create a zero-carbon energy system through long-term stewardship that benefits and motivates current and future residents and provides a model to inspire wider action. The plan includes actions to reduce energy usage and create warmer homes, workplaces, and community spaces, as well as increase renewable energy generation.

New energy groups have been established in Freeland and Hanborough, giving residents the opportunity to lead the way on the achievement of legally binding net zero targets and a cleaner, greener energy system as soon as possible.




