LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR, REVD DR STEVE STEWART

The Passing Age of Atheism – and the Hope of Christmas

For more than a century, atheism has promised to free humanity from the “superstitions” of faith. In the early and mid-20th century, confident voices declared that science had rendered belief in God obsolete. Later, in the 21st century, the so-called “New Atheism” — led by writers such as Richard Dawkins and Christopher Hitchens — claimed that reason alone could give life meaning, morality, and purpose. Yet as the years have passed, both the old and the new atheism have lost much of their persuasive power.

Why? Because while atheism can question, it cannot and has miserably failed to deal with the personal and political issues of our age. It can criticise, but it cannot create hope. It can describe the mechanisms of the world, but it cannot tell us why love, beauty, or goodness matter. In an age marked by loneliness, anxiety, and uncertainty, many are discovering that disbelief has little to offer when life becomes hard or loss comes close. And, of course, atheism is totally incapable of dealing with the problem of death itself.

By contrast, Christianity does not rest on abstract ideas but on concrete historical events — the birth of Jesus Christ in Bethlehem, and his death and resurrection in Jerusalem. God entered our world not as a concept or a moral theory but as a person. The Christian story tells us that we are loved, known, and never forgotten. It shows that life has purpose because it comes from the Creator’s hand, and that death is not the end because the child of the manger became the man of the cross and the risen Lord of Easter morning.

Atheism says, “You are alone in a vast, indifferent universe.” Christmas replies, “Emmanuel — God is with us.” That simple message continues to change lives. It gives dignity to the poor, courage to the suffering, and joy to all who believe.

This Christmas, our village churches will once again tell that true story — through carol services, Christingle service, crib service, Midnight Communion, and the warmth of worship on Christmas morning. These aren’t just seasonal traditions; they are living invitations to rediscover the truth that God has not abandoned the world but stepped into it to redeem and renew it.

The age of atheism may have faded, but the light that shines in the darkness still shines on — and the darkness has not overcome it. Only Jesus Christ can truly deliver on my needs, your needs and the needs of the world.

We would love you to be with us to celebrate and to hear more any of our Christmas services which are listed below.


POPPY APPEAL 2025

SPEEDWATCH

Unfortunately, we have had to close down the Speedwatch activity in Freeland for the current time due to an insufficient number of volunteers coming forward. This is despite several announcements made that more people are required to enable us to continue and operate successfully.

We are a small group of local residents worried about the big climate change picture, yet with serious concerns on how to take our own, often small, steps to reduce energy usage, lower bills and be less reliant on fossil fuels. These are all big issues. We hope that you will find FEG useful to help cut through some of the jargon, put you in touch with neighbours who are willing to share information on their own energy changes and be part of a bigger network. For FEG our network is being part of CAPZero – that is the Community Action Group for net zero with Green Tea in Eynsham and Go Green Hanborough in Long Hanborough, and the Low Carbon Hub (LCH). The concentration is not merely on the on the domestic as in the New Year we expect to support LCH with their meetings for local businesses. Keep your eye out for those invitations and notices.

We would like to thank everyone who completed a form for our recent Energy Audit form over the summer – yes you can still send in a form but sorry too late for prizes. With the forms we already hold, we will be in touch with many of you to follow up on some of the comments. In particular where there is a suggestion of being a local contact willing to talk about experience in making energy efficiency changes. Or, if no changes have been made but you indicated you are interested in finding out about ‘House like Mine’ project.

A further thanks to everyone who completed the follow-up enquiry after last winter’s home thermal imaging experience. It is tricky getting exactly the right weather conditions to carry out thermal imaging, and it is useful to understand what the next steps for you were, to help plan ours.

Hope to see you at our table at the **‘Village Fayre’ on Saturday 22nd November** where there will be an Energy Advisor with guidance on how to keep you warm this winter, and whether there is grant help available for reducing your energy use. Look forward to seeing you there.

FREELAND METHODIST CHAPEL UPDATE

Charitable status is important to our plans to acquire and renovate the Chapel: it doesn't change any aspects of the share offer, but could add Gift Aid income to personal donations and make donating more attractive for businesses. Progress towards charitable status has been slow and complicated—but we are moving forward steadily.

The 'critical path' to securing ownership of the Chapel is:

- Financial Conduct Authority agreement, a new bank account, and HMRC approval for charitable status
- Dissolution of Freeland Community Benefit Society, with current members of the management committee co-opted to the new society ("Freeland Community Hub") as its management committee
- Freeland Community Hub's Share Offer issued, with share proceeds and donations paid into the new charitable bank account, thereby ensuring any donations are eligible for tax deductibility and Gift Aid
- Completion of the purchase of the Chapel once the legal aspects have been agreed
- AGM called shortly after purchase is completed, with Freeland Community Hub's hundreds of new shareholders invited to attend; at this, we hope some of them will consider putting themselves forward for the new management committee.

Meanwhile, thanks to everyone who came along to our Chapel Neighbours' consultation on 17th November, and our 'Pop-up, Pop-in' workshops on 22nd and 25th November to give us your ideas on how you think the Chapel should look and feel. We had great fun – pictures to follow.

There's also been a tremendous response to our call for volunteers - 2026 will be a year of fundraising for the Chapel renovations. The most immediate opportunity is obtaining Section 106 funding from the Pye development opposite the school; we are still in discussion with WODC about this. We are also preparing an application to the National Heritage Lottery fund and a local charity. That's not all; we have some exciting community-led events coming up next year such as concerts and an auction of promises. **Contd....**





The assessor stated in his report that “*key strengths highlighted in the assessment included the staff, cleanliness, and the attraction itself. The carefully curated displays offer a fascinating insight into Oxfordshire’s transport heritage, bringing the past vividly to life. What makes the experience even more special is the team of staff and volunteers, who are friendly, knowledgeable, and clearly passionate about what they do, creating a warm and engaging atmosphere throughout the visit.*”

The assessor identified that we have some work to do on the toilets and catering facilities. The trustees have formed a sub-committee to review these and other suggestions in the report, which would improve our visitor offering.

A different mystery shopper will visit during 2026 when the museum will be reassessed. Locally other attractions with the award include Blenheim, Oxford Castle & Prison, The Ashmolean, The Sheldonian, Bodleian Libraries, Didcot Railway Centre and Waterperry Gardens.

RECYCLING CENTRES

Non-Oxfordshire residents will face a **£15 charge** if they want to use recycling centres in the county from January onwards.

People will also have to **book in advance** and will need to provide **proof of address** on arrival. The changes aim to address the issue of people from outside the county using recycling centres in Oxfordshire at the cost of the taxpayer for people to access the centres.

WEST OXFORDSHIRE LOCAL PLAN 2043

The Preferred Spatial Options Consultation

The document sets out a range of potential locations where new homes, employment sites, nature recovery areas and supporting infrastructure could be provided. The Council is seeking views from residents before any sites are selected for inclusion in the draft Local Plan, which will be published for a further, final period of consultation in spring next year.

It is important to stress that the potential locations that are put forward are initial proposals, not final choices. This is why it is vital for the residents to respond to this consultation.


The challenges are significant. The Council's previous assessment of the housing need in West Oxfordshire was 549 houses per year. However, the government requires the Council to deliver 905 new homes per year. Allowing for some contingency, this means we need to build 18,000 homes by 2043. As there are currently 48,000 homes in West Oxfordshire, we will be increasing the District's housing stock by a third.

Such rapid housing growth will challenge already strained infrastructure, such as transport, healthcare, schools and utilities, such as sewer systems and the national grid. This is why the Council is focusing on planning most of the growth alongside the infrastructure, such as transport corridors (A40) and services, and securing the investments it depends on.


Within Freeland and Hanborough ward, one strategic site for 300 homes is proposed, 'Land South West of Hanborough Station'. It is located between the new residential development around the station, Pinsley Wood and Lower Road (see page 63). I would like to encourage the residents to consider the positive and negative impacts that this development would have on our environment and communities, and make their comments.
