

#### LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR, REVD DR STEVE STEWART

#### Rules or Relationship?

I was being given a lift somewhere this week by a group of people whom I hadn't met before, but were kind enough to drop me off. When people find themselves with a clergyman in the car, it comes as no surprise to me that they will begin to make jokes about "the vicar this" and "the vicar that" – all of which I don't mind at all. Nothing worse than vicars who take themselves too seriously!

But one thing they said (and I have had this a lot over the years) is "we'd better stop swearing lads: the vicar's in the car!". It was kind of them to think that I might mind them swearing, but it also reveals something I think about what people imagine Christianity – and Christians – to be. So often when I speak with people they imagine that Christianity is about a set of moral codes. A toolset to help one lead a particular kind of virtuous life.

At a darker level, this can result in people thinking that Christians are enormously judgemental, self-righteous, the "moral majority". Some pretend Christians can be like that, but not true believers. Christianity isn't about a moral code at all. It is about a relationship. A relationship with God, who created us and loves us.

True Christians are simply those who put their faith in Jesus Christ to forgive their sins. Above all people, Christians are aware that they cannot generate righteousness out of themselves: they know they have to rely on the God who loves them to transform them. If there is any righteousness in me, it has come as a gift from God. If there is any unrighteousness in me, it is because I am resistant to his Spirit at work in me.

Christianity is not a moral code to be learnt; it is a relationship with God which is to be enjoyed. If you would like to hear something of that potential relationship, then come to any of our churches on a Sunday morning at 10 AM – St Peter and St Paul Church Hanborough, St Mary the Virgin in Freeland, or Christ Church Long Hanborough. What you'll find is not a bunch of self-righteous people, but a community always open to newcomers who simply want to know and enjoy the God who loves us.

#### **Public Consultations**

There are a several consultations about to go live or already open including **Salt Cross, 2041 Local Plan and Oxrail.**

Due to time constraints the Parish notes were not available before the Freeland Grapevine print deadline this month. Any amendments will be made next month.

#### **WODC** update

A 3.5 million investment has been approved for upgrades to the three leisure centres across West Oxfordshire. The District Council is keen to ensure this funding is delivered locally and in a timely manner, ahead of the planned merger with the County Council, to avoid the risk of resources being redirected to other areas.

#### Rembrance Sunday

The Parish Council is pleased to support the raising of the Union Flag on the Village Hall. During the two weeks around Remembrance, the flag will be flown to honour and remember all those who gave their lives, marking this important 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. We are mindful of the difficult news in the world today, and want to reassure residents that the flag is being raised purely as a symbol of respect and remembrance within our Community.

#### **Councillor Vacancy**

We have a vacancy on the Parish Council and are looking to co-opt a new member to join the team. Each member brings their own skills to the team which helps the village to thrive. Please drop us an email if you are interested or just want to find out more.

#### Fly Tipping into Bins

We have had issues with glass bottles and cat litter being disposed of in our bins. Please can you use your own to dispose of the waste. Bottles go out bi-weekly with the blue top and green waste bins. Cat litter should be placed in the general waste bin, not in the bin on the A4095 otherwise the bin will be refused to be emptied by the contractor.

#### Village Hall Parking

This is a polite reminder that the parking for the Village Hall is for users of the Hall, field and playground, and not for car parking for residents as car storage. The space is already limited.

#### Fix my Street

We urge you all to continue to keep using the Fix My Street App that reports any issues to the County Council. This can be used for potholes, overgrown hedges, kerb stone damage and also such matters as grass cutting on the A4095. Additionally, if you would like to become a super user that will help speed up the process in which things can be repaired.







#### FREELAND METHODIST CHAPEL UPDATE

Around 70 people turned out for the meeting on 6 October - thank you! Here's a summary from **Freeland Community Benefit Society (FCBS)** of what we discussed:

**Vision**: We recapped the vision for the Chapel - a tenanted café and community space which will evolve to fit the needs of the village. This will be a flexible space supporting functions like hot desking, youth activities, and community groups.

**Current activities:** We discussed current activity for the FCBS management committee, which includes examining the draft contract issued by the Methodist Circuit, applying for charitable status, working towards grant applications, and more in-depth building surveys. We are also engaging an architect.

**Charitable status**: Our application for charitable status changes nothing in terms of the proposal put to the village previously—the offer will still be to buy shares in the Community Hub, and those shares will be repayable subject to reserves. However, charitable status does provide benefits for donations, whether allowing taxpaying donors to add gift aid, or donating businesses to claim tax deductibility. We are expecting to secure charitable status in December—then can issue the share offer and collect funds.

**Grant opportunities**: These have narrowed significantly over recent years, and so our focus is currently on the National Lottery Heritage Fund and a local charity, as well as the so-called 'Section 106' money arising from the newly-approved planning application.

**Workstreams**: These are I. Building Purchase; 2. Fundraising for renovation, 3. Renovation and 4. Village Engagement. We have a range of jobs that we'll need help with across all these, from managing architects to fund-raising, landscaping and decorating.

**Next steps:** We're setting up a liaison group with neighbours to the site to discuss concerns such as noise or parking. We're producing a set of briefing sheets answering the key questions, e.g., charitable status, volunteering. And we're getting ready to launch the share offer and payment details imminently. 

#### **NORTH LEIGH ROMAN VILLA'S BEST YEAR YET**

North Leigh Roman Villa volunteers have welcomed over 2,200 visitors to see its splendid mosaic floor in **2025.** This represents more visitors than in any previous year since the group formed in 2019. Visitor donations in 2025 have also been very generous, with over one thousand pounds given to help improve the site.

Even though volunteers had already created colour leaflets, a family trail, and an audio guide to the site in previous years, the aspirations of the group to enhance visitors' enjoyment of visiting North Leigh Roman Villa led to a number of new initiatives in 2025. Blenheim Palace kindly provided two new benches in the spring. An artistically talented volunteer has painted panels to show how the decorated wall plaster in the dining room where the mosaic lies might have looked in the villa's heyday 1,700 years ago. Another volunteer with expertise in textiles has begun an ambitious project to embroider an accurate representation of the surviving mosaic. Community members are welcome to participate and add their "stitches in time" to this tapestry as it is being worked on.

Digital technology has been embraced as well. A competition ran over the summer, whose prize was kindly funded by Blenheim Palace, in the digital construction game Minecraft to show how the villa would once have looked. The winning entries will be shown on site next year in a further step to bring the original villa buildings and courtyard back to life for visitors. The results of the dedicated gamers' efforts are quite remarkable.

Originally North Leigh Roman Villa was the heart of a large working farm. And the Romans were responsible for introducing many plants to Britain that we take for granted today. To highlight this important aspect of our Roman past, ecology and gardening-minded volunteers have begun carefully planting species that first arrived with the Romans. This enhancement to the site will continue in 2026.

After the major investment made in 2024, it is very pleasing to see increased visits to North Leigh Roman Villa in 2025 and so many further improvements.

Set within a peaceful landscape on the banks of the River Evenlode, North Leigh Roman Villa is considered to be one of the largest villas in Roman Britain with a history of occupation spanning 5 centuries. At its most extensive in the early 4th century AD it included 3 bath suites, 16 mosaic floors and 11 rooms with under-floor heating.

Cont'd .....

Today visitors can imagine the villa's former richness as they walk through the rectangular footprint of its walls – but the mosaic house hides the real gem of a near complete mosaic floor. The mosaics form the floor of villa's winter dining room and, as the only example in Oxfordshire still found in their original location, they give a powerful sense of the Villa's original opulence. The mosaics returned to public opening in September 2019 after a gap of almost 30 years:thanks to the efforts of North Leigh Roman Villa Volunteers [NLRVV], a local group working with English Heritage. Since then, 9,850 visitors have seen the mosaics, in spite of covid restrictions in 2020 and 2021.

The efforts of NLRVV's volunteers were recognised by a Heritage Alliance Commendation Award for volunteering in 2020. In 2021 the Blenheim Bursary fund awarded the group  $\pounds$ 5,000 to support renovation of the site's Custodian's Cottage. Visitor donations made at the site now exceed  $\pounds$ 4,300.

At the start of 2022 it was announced that North Leigh was one of just 4 English Heritage sites to be supported by a £1 m Michael Bishop Foundation donation. The work funded by this generous donation ran in 3 phases throughout 2024, transforming the Custodian's Cottage, the condition of the NW range of the villa remains, and replacing the roof of the Mosaic House.

As well as North Leigh Roman Villa, English Heritage cares for over a million objects and hundreds of historic sites in every part of England. As Heritage is for everybody, that's why the charity opens them up, shares their stories and finds new ways for everybody to enjoy, learn, play and create.



## **OXFORD BUS MUSEUM**

## Hallowe'en and half term: Fun for the family

On Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> October we shall be decorating the museum and buses and laying on some surprises for our visitors. For children there will be a 'Pumpkin Hunt' in the museum with prizes for those who find all of the dozen pumpkins. (Adults are also allowed to take part.) There will also be a display of live spooky owls brought to the museum by Alan Charlett, who runs Al's Owls. For a small extra charge visitors will be allowed to hold the owls.

We shall run regular bus rides from **I I.30am.** The buses will be dressed appropriately for Hallowe'en. On **Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> October** we shall run an additional evening twilight bus ride. More details will be on our website nearer the date.

#### **Bus seats donation**

Richard King has given the museum some bus seats, which were originally on an Oxford Renown, CFC 356C, and have been stored in the loft of his garage for the last 40 years! This AEC Renown was new to City of Oxford Motor Services (COMS) in December 1965 seating 38 upstairs and 27 on the lower deck. It was originally painted in Oxford's traditional livery. In about autumn 1970, it was repainted red all over, except for the lower deck window area which was painted duck egg green. After nationalisation the bus was repainted into NBC poppy red, which was its final livery in Oxford.

Richard and his cousin bought CFC 356C direct from COMS in 1978. They converted it so it could be used as a holiday van in Europe with bunk beds and a mini kitchen. It travelled around France and Italy. In 1980 it was in England and was hired for a promotion to the Portsmouth Evening News, whose driver took it under a low bridge in Porchester with the usual result! The seats were extracted from the wreckage and stored. Initially, it was planned to restore the bus, but it never happened and CFC 356C was scrapped.



Forty years later we have been given the seats and may be given the frames in due course. We have recently had some seats for another bus reupholstered because the leather sides had deteriorated. If the moquette on the seats of very old buses fails it is difficult, if not impossible, to obtain replacement moquette with the right design. Spares seats may come in useful in the future.

# **A40 BARNARD GATE**

Local councillors have welcomed the recent approval of road safety projects across Oxfordshire — including the new long awaited safety scheme for the **A40 Barnard Gate** junctions. The scheme is part of a broader set of measures recently endorsed by the County Council to tackle high-risk junctions and reduce serious road traffic incidents. The approved scheme introduces an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order (ETRO) that will prohibit right turns out of both Barnard Gate junctions onto the A40, obliging vehicles to turn left only. It forms part of Oxfordshire's Vision Zero programme to eliminate deaths and serious injuries on the county's roads.

With £100,000 allocated in the County budget for safety improvements at this location, the scheme will include enhanced signage, particularly directing drivers toward the Cuckoo Lane junction as a safer alternative, and minor works such as kerbing or temporary barriers.

County Councillor Liam Walker, who has long championed improvements to this junction, said: "I'm pleased that Oxfordshire County Council has moved forward and approved this scheme. It's a tangible step forward in improving safety along the A40 and I fully support any measure that helps reduce risk to road users."

"I'm particularly pleased that additional signage toward Cuckoo Lane has been included, something I advocated for during a site visit. Encouraging safer travel patterns is crucial. We must however ensure this is not the end but the beginning and I will continue to work with the council to enhance any improvements if needed." Local residents and parish councils have long expressed concern about safety along this stretch of the A40, and the approval is being seen as a positive move — though with calls to go further:

Lysette Nicholls, Chair of South Leigh Parish Council, said: "We welcome the decision to include the Barnard Gate improvements as part of the wider road safety projects. It's encouraging to see movement on an issue we have been raising for years."

"That said, our community remains deeply concerned about the right-turn into South Leigh, which this approved scheme does not address. We will continue to press for its inclusion in future phases. We look forward to working alongside Cllr Walker and the County to ensure safety improvements continue across the whole stretch of road."

The scheme is expected to be implemented **later in 2025**. As with other road safety projects approved across Oxfordshire, it will be monitored over an 18-month experimental period during which public feedback will be gathered and adjustments considered.



# A message from Witney - Oxford Transport Group Urgent Transport Solutions Needed for "West Oxfordshire - the line that never was" More consultations!

On Monday, 22 September, Oxfordshire County Council held a meeting with stakeholders to present its latest transport strategy for the county. For West Oxfordshire residents hoping for concrete progress, the session was a familiar disappointment.

The information released wasn't momentous — it simply brought together existing proposals under a single approach: expanding Banbury, the cross-country line to Cambridge, a couple of stations here and there (like Wantage, which has been discussed for the last thirty years), and doubling the first part of the Cotswold line. The meeting was clearly a tick-box exercise rather than a genuine consultation. Allowing for the usual speaker overruns, the actual Q&A session squeezed in just six questions over ten minutes from a 90-minute programme.

# West Oxfordshire: The Black Hole

Most notable was the absence of firm proposals for WestOxfordshire. Except for a brief presentation at the end, showing a red line described as "an opportunity for intermodal transport still under discussion," West Oxfordshire remained a black hole in the county's approach, dismissed with vague mentions of "more consultations needed."

# The time for action is Now

The choice is clear: accept another twenty five years of inaction, or lobby the council and all local politicians to demand real solutions. The 16,000 new homes planned for our area are expected to generate over 32,000 additional daily car journeys without alternative and sustainable transport, means living standards in our District will degrade. We cannot afford to be left behind.

Don't let West Oxfordshire remain the county's forgotten corner.

Join our campaign for a railway from Oxford to Witney and Carterton before it is too late. (witneyoxfordtransport.org.uk)
