As I write this, we have been incredibly blessed with days of wonderfully sunny Spring weather. A sign that something new is happening: leaves appearing, daffodils blooming, warmer temperatures, maybe that first mow of the lawn and the smell of fresh cut grass.





Wild Oxfordshire - May News - Wildflowers Wild Road Verges

Over 700 species of wildflower grow on road verges, which provide important linear habitats and wildlife corridors. We can combat the 20% drop since 1990 in floral diversity (reported by Plantlife) of verges by adopting better management strategies to protect and cultivate grass verges. One of the best strategies to encourage your local parish to adopt is a two-cut management approach to suppress coarse grass whilst encouraging more diverse wildflower growth. See the graph below to work out which timing works best for your local area! The graph is

taken from Plantlife's 'Managing grassland road verges: a best practice guide', which you can download from their website.

It is then also important to collect the cuttings. Wildflowers of species-rich grasslands grow best in lower fertility soils, whilst high fertility soils support vigorous grass growth. Therefore, taking the biomass, and thus nutrients, they contain away from the verge can reduce the layer of dead grass or thatch and 'open up' the soil surface to

allow seed germination. Repeated over several years, this benefits less robust growth and more diversity, and therefore less management is required to create beautiful natural spaces on the roadside. Garden Mini-meadows

Lawns, or sections of garden can be turned into wildflower meadows in several ways, depending on how much time and effort you want to put in and the result you want to achieve:

The easiest option is to simply leave some or all, of your lawn unmown and to let the grass grow long, where any wildflowers are already present and for them to be able to reach the height needed to flower. Mow and remove the cuttings in September.

20th May World Bee Day!

20th May is annual World Bee Day! Hopefully you're already helping bees get a wide range of diverse nectar sources by partaking in 'No Mow May'. Some other ways to help protect our declining bee populations include purchasing sustainable local honey, ditching harmful synthetic pesticides, providing a suitable water source for thirsty pollinators (can simply be a shallow bowl of water with stones in it for bees to land on), or hosting an event to raise awareness in your local area.

OXFORD BUS MUSEUM incorporating the Morris Motors Museum and Historic Cycle Collection

April marks the start of the summer season with **heritage bus rides** on the **first and third Sundays** in each month until the end of September.

Older visitors may like to visit our Historic Cycle Collection on the mezzanine floor in the Morris Motors Museum.

1942 Bedford OWB being restored to wartime condition.

The work and expense of restoring our buses often gets forgotten. As well as restorations in our own workshops we have two buses being restored offsite by a professional company.

Our Bedford OWB, BBW 291, was made of steel in 1942, because any available



aluminium was requisitioned for the repair and manufacture of aircraft. This make restoration more difficult as steel sheets are more difficult to bend into the required shape than pliable aluminium. There was also a shortage of skilled labour, as wartime priorities were the munitions and aircraft production factories.

BBW 291 had a single shell apart from the cove panels for lights. The interior roof will be painted with a cream gloss when it is finished. The outside is to be painted in chocolate brown, as it was in 1942.

The interior wood capping is being made specially because the original capping had woodworm. It will be varnished as was the original. New glass is needed for the windows. Originally plate glass would have been used, but today toughened glass will have to be used for safety reasons. Wooden slatted seats, with no padding, will be installed as they were in 1942. After the war the bus's operator, Houses of Watlington, would have upgraded the seats to be padded.

Ashley Blackman has stripped off the bulkhead in the cab area and the engine has been brought to Long Hanborough for a complete overhaul.

A problem is to get new parts. We are currently seeking period tungsten bulbs to fit in the roof. Modern LED lighting does not give the same warm effect.

New tyres were ordered before Christmas from a specialist firm making vintage tyres, Camac Tyres. Unfortunately, the company has been taken over by Avon Tyres, who do not know when they will be producing more vintage tyres. If we go to another supplier each tyre will cost an extra £90. This is holding up work as Ashley needs to turn the bus round to get access to the other side.

Three other OWBs exist, but they may not be 100% correct. Ashley is working from an original specification sheet so our bus will be exactly right. It is thought to be the only wartime Oxfordshire bus to have survived.

May will be a busy month for the museum. On Sunday 4th and Bank Holiday Monday 5th May, The Oxford & District Model Railway Club will be bringing their displays to the museum. Visitors will be allowed to control some models. On Sunday 25th May, we have visiting preserved buses coming to the museum, including London buses of the 1950s. The following day, Bank Holiday Monday 26th May we are hosting a display of classic cars.


UNACCEPTED FREELAND RAMBLERS 13/04/2025
