

#### **LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR, REVD DR STEVE STEWART**


The night Tolkien helped convert C.S. Lewis in Addison's Walk at Magdalen College, Oxford...

Looking this week at a set of C S Lewis's works in my bookcase I realised that it was just over forty years ago that I read all these books - not the Narnia stories, but Lewis's reflections on theology. These included Mere Christianity, The Problem of Pain, Surprised by Joy, and Fern-Seed and Elephants. All excellent works, with the foundational in shaping my conviction that the Bible was a faithful account of God's activity on earth in the person of Jesus Christ. It reminded me of some of the key steps in Lewis himself becoming a Christian.



Being one of the 20th century's most beloved Christian writers, many are surprised to learn that Lewis was once an atheist. His journey to faith came gradually, but a key turning point was a conversation he had with his close friend, J.R.R. Tolkien, the author of The Lord of the Rings. What convinced Lewis was not a theological argument, but a discussion about myths and fairy tales.

Tolkien believed that myths weren't lies, but reflections of deep, eternal truths. For him, stories of sacrifice, resurrection, and good triumphing over evil appeared in every culture because they echoed the one true story—the Gospel. He called Christianity the "true myth": the myth that entered history and became fact in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.



On the evening of 19 September 1931, Lewis, Tolkien, and another friend, Hugo Dyson, strode together through Addison's Walk in Magdalen College, Oxford. By 1931, Lewis had come to believe in some vague idea about "God". He had also long loved mythology and fairy stories, and thought Christianity was just one more made-up tale. Tolkien gently challenged him: what if the story of Christ wasn't just another myth, but the myth that really happened?

This conversation left a deep impression. A few days later, Lewis wrote that he had moved from believing in God to believing in Christ. Shortly after that, while riding to Whipsnade Zoo in a motorbike sidecar, he realised he now fully believed in Jesus as the Son of God.

Tolkiens's insights into fairy tales did not just help Lewis become a Christian - they helped shape the way ~~Lewis would later write The Chronicles of Narnia, bringing deep Christian truths to life through story. As Tolkien once said, "We tell stories because God is a storyteller." And in Jesus, we find the greatest story of all - true myth becomes flesh.

He brought many plants to show us, some of which were for sale. He informed us of the conditions needed to grow these plants successfully. All need natural light but not direct sunlight. Soil used should be free draining, adding grit or perlite and peat free. He waters his plants sparingly twice a week with rain water, from April to September. He repots most of them every 2 years into the next size pot. He answered many questions and if anyone is interested in knowing more he would be willing to help. His address can be given by any Gardening Club Committee member though he is well known by many people already. Another excellent speaker and very good evening's information. We were glad to welcome some new members who have recently moved into the village.

#### NET ZERO CARBON STANDARD FOR SALT CROSS GARDEN VILLAGE

A major milestone has been reached by the West Oxfordshire District Council team on the path to delivering one of the most forward-thinking, sustainable new communities in the country. The Council's Net Zero policy for Salt Cross Garden Village received the green light from the Planning Inspector. The policy, which aims to ensure that all buildings at Salt Cross are Net Zero carbon in operation, has been found to comply with national policy and to be 'sound' in other respects, subject to several modifications. It marks a significant achievement for the Council and places Salt Cross among the UK's leading developments in sustainable placemaking.

The Council resubmitted the Net Zero policy for re-examination earlier this year; the proposals were supported by strong evidence demonstrating that Net Zero carbon homes and buildings are both financially viable for developers, but also essential in the face of the climate and ecological emergencies.

This is a landmark decision that puts West Oxfordshire at the forefront of climate-conscious development and should provide real confidence to other local authorities across the country that, with a strong evidence base, it is possible to adopt Net Zero policies that are both deliverable and legally robust.

The modifications will enhance clarity, remove duplication, and reflect evolving technical standards, making the policy more practical to implement across a large, phased development. Once modifications are agreed, the amended policy will be published for a six-week public consultation, paving the way for the Council to formally adopt the full Salt Cross Area Action Plan.





#### **OXFORD BUS AND MORRIS MOTORS MUSEUM**

As part of the Oxford Open Doors festival organised by the Oxford Preservation Trust, we shall be giving free bus rides round the City of Oxford on **Saturday 13th September**. We shall be based in Bonn Square and running regular buses from **10.30am until 3.30pm**. Most people board our buses at either Bonn Square or next to Nuffield College, but the buses will pick up at other points around the city. Details are on our website.

Our Bullnose Morris was one of 54,151 cars built by William Morris in 1925. It was Morris's golden year as this was 41% of the total British private motor car production. Only seven years earlier his production had been only 387 cars—99% less. Morris had been reducing his prices each year in the early 1920s. For 1925 the price of the Morris Cowley fell by £30 to £195, and the two-seater fell by £23 to £175 despite introducing balloon tyres as standard and other upgrades.

The British economy stuttered in 1926 and sales were well down on 1925 with only 32,183 being despatched. By now the car design could be traced back to 1913 and looked old-fashioned. The company needed to modernise its cars, so the Bullnose radiator was discarded.


Our museums house lots of oddities. One is the pictured pub sign from 'The Bullnose Morris' when it was operated by the Oxford brewers, Morrells. The pub was opened in

1969 by Morrells in Watlington Road, Blackbird Leys, and had a good trade when Oxford United was playing at home. It was affectionately known as 'The Bully'. The pub passed indirectly to Greene King when the Morrell family sold the Lion Brewery in St Thomas Street in central Oxford but was closed permanently in October 2020 as a direct result of Covid.


